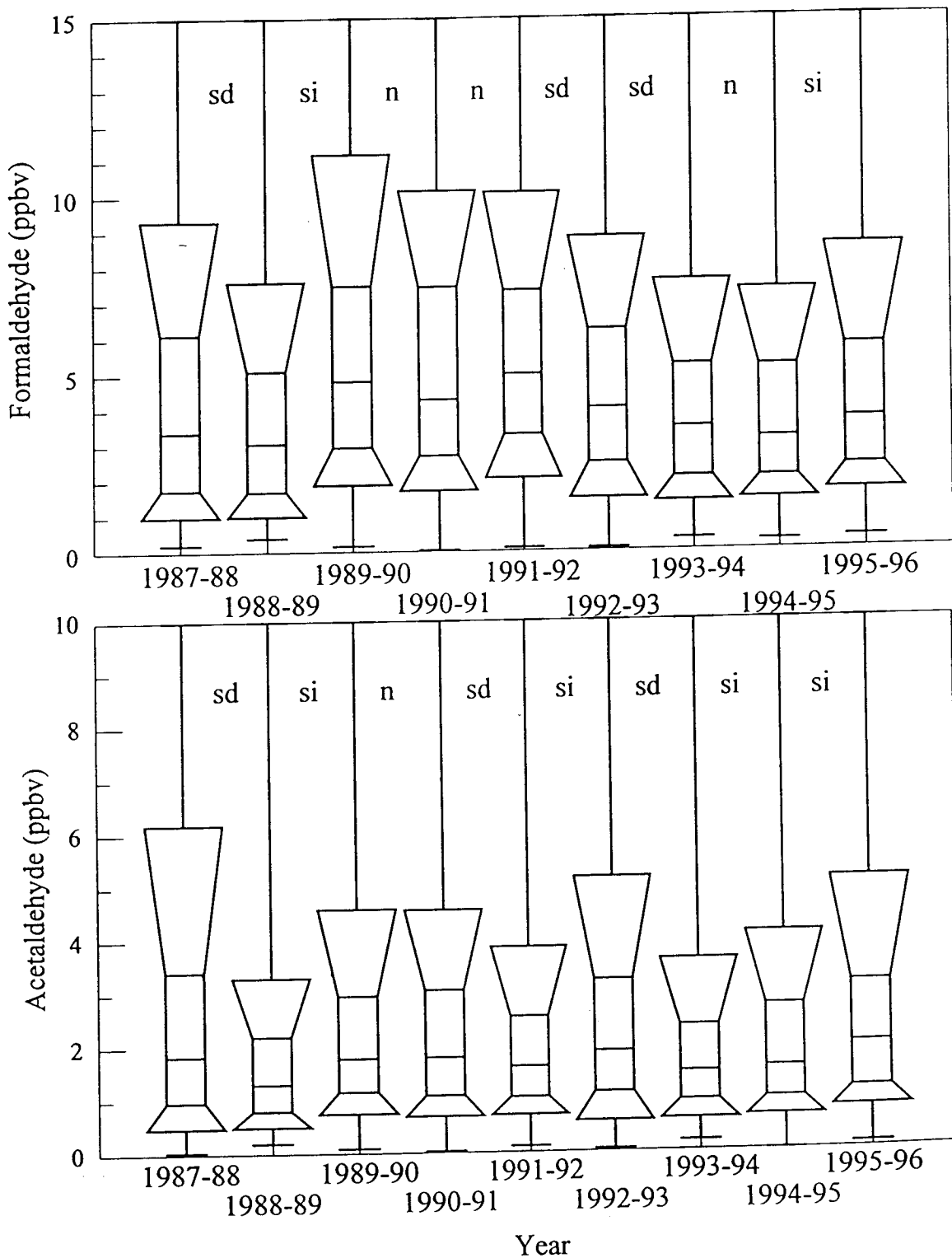


Figure 1. Box plots of the winter average formaldehyde and acetaldehyde concentrations measured in downtown Denver for the winters of 1987-88 through 1995-96. The horizontal lines in the box plot have the following meanings, proceeding from the bottom to top: the line at the bottom represents the lowest concentration measured, the line forming the bottom of the box is the 10th percentile, next is the 25th percentile; near the middle of the box is the median, then the 75th percentile, and 90th percentile. The maximum concentration measured is off scale of the plots.

**Figure 2.** Summary of the emissions data from Colorado's mandatory IM240 emission test program. Data is presented for hydrocarbon (HC), carbon monoxide (CO) and nitrogen oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) emissions by model year of the vehicle. The oxygenated fuel period (oxy) summarizes emissions data collected during January, February, November and December 1995, while the non-oxygenated fuel period (nonoxy) summarizes data collected in the April through September 1995 period.
